

PNMC COURSE OFFERINGS

To satisfy credentialing requirements PNMC is offering the following courses. They are open to anyone interested within the conference, but are designed for those in the credentialing process.

Costs for courses will cover instructor's costs and materials needed by the instructor. Books, lodging and travel are the responsibility of the registrant. Those in the credentialing process will receive a 33% reduction on the course fee, as PNMC's part in sharing the costs. The remaining costs for those in the credentialing process should be shared between the participant and their congregation.

INSTRUCTORS:

Sheldon Burkhalter

Having grown up in the Mennonite church in Ohio, graduated from a Mennonite H.S., and sensed a call to prepare for pastoral ministry, Sheldon wished to explore life in other Christian communities. He spent the next 9 years studying at Taylor University, an evangelical college, and Fuller Theological Seminary. After becoming a Presbyterian and receiving his M.Div. he faced the decision whether to seek ministry in the Mennonite church. So he spent a year and a half doing research and writing a dissertation on the Anabaptist reformation. This foundation led him to 38 years of ministry in the Mennonite church: 17 as a pastor, 14 as an agency administrator, and 6 as a conference minister. Sheldon is married to Janis Sprunger, father of 2 married children, and grandfather of two.

Leo Hartshorn

Leo Hartshorn has 36 years of pastoral leadership in congregations in California, Texas, and Pennsylvania. From 2002 to 2009 he was Minister of Peace and Justice for Mennonite Mission Network, Mennonite Church USA. Leo is also co-founder and co-director of Drumming for Peace an organization that teaches and witnesses publicly for peace through drumming, rhythm, storytelling, and music. In May of 2002 Leo received his doctorate from Lancaster Theological Seminary with a focus on Anabaptist preaching. His dissertation, *Interpretation and Preaching as Communal and Dialogical Practices: An Anabaptist Perspective*, was published by Edwin Mellen Press in December, 2006. As an adjunct professor Leo has taught classes at Lancaster Theological Seminary, Eastern Mennonite University, Lancaster extension. Leo is also an artist and has had his art used in various publication in the US and internationally. Leo has been married for 37 years to Iris de Leon-Hartshorn, Executive Conference Minister of Pacific Northwest Mennonite Conference, has three adult children and is raising his 6 year old grandson.
